## REPAIR OF THE CHURCH TOWER UPDATE



The tower has been inspected by three different, independent engineers who basically came up with the same opinion as to why the tower is leaking. There are no guarantees as the tower is close to 100 years old. We have hired an engineer who will oversee the project once the repair work is started. The engineer will talk with the interested contractors, put it out for bid, and make recommendations to the Finance Council. The repair to the chapel will not take place until a suitable period of time has passed and we are sure the initial problem has been corrected. We are fortunate to have such a beautiful building to gather in for worship. As the building ages the Finance Council will continue to put in motion the necessary repairs to the building. The tower itself will require more work once this repair work is completed.

## A Message from the Co-Pastors

Who do you say that I am? I have come to believe that this is such an important question. How we answer the question has a direct impact on how we look at life and how we deal with life's situations. When we go back to the gospel we recognize that Jesus is not interested so much in what the crowd says but what the disciples say. In another version of this gospel, the evangelist relates the incident somewhat differently in that Jesus asks the apostles three times "Who do you say that I am?" With the first two replies the apostles give a third person answer but he insists that their answer be from their heart and not their head. Who do you say that I am? How do we answer that? Is it a third party response, is it our own and who or what helped us define it?

As you all know I have been ordained 39 years and as I look back on those years one of the most profound movements in my priesthood has been in my "definition", if you will, of who God is for me. Having been in the seminary right after the Vatican Council so many things were being challenged and redefined. If there was one thing that I really came to terms with during that time was the difference between faith and theology. Theology was not faith but an understanding of faith. Yet after ordination, even though I had a good knowledge of God the Father, Son, and Spirit. I came to realize that I had no relationship with God. I had an intellectual acquaintance with God. Over the years, through spiritual direction and prayer I have developed a relationship which I believe is still evolving. Remember the quote of Thomas Aquinas, "once you defined God, you've lost him."

So when we hear the question; "Who do you say I am?" How do we answer that? Where does it come from? Who helped us come to this conclusion? How we answer that question has a direct impact on how we deal with life, how we create priorities, how we deal with success or failure, how we deal with relationships, how we look to commitment, how we look and deal with tragedy, sickness, and death. However we answer the question the end result should be one of peace, comfort, consolation, guidance, and hope. For me the answer to that question came through knowledge of but enhanced by an introduction with Spirituality, the scriptures, spiritual writers, prayer, and spiritual direction that I have grown in relationship with God.

One of the things that I have discovered is that it is in relationship with God, that handling life's situations becomes somewhat easier and less overwhelming. For me the answer to the question "Who do you say that I am?" is threefold: God the Father is the welcoming father as in the story of the prodigal son, Jesus is the teacher, who by his life, death, and resurrection, teaches us who we are to and how we get there and that good rises above evil, and the Spirit is the shepherd who is ever-present and guides us through life and reveals to us our truth.

I find great comfort in that God. Who is God for you?
