## A Message from the Co-Pastors

I can remember as a child hearing the nuns use the phrase, it is a mystery. As a little child I remember accepting that. As I got older I began to feel that the term was a cop out for things that they did not know. As the years have gone by and my faith has evolved I appreciate the term all the more. I gravitate toward sayings, phrases, pictures that help me understand or image the mystery a little more. The Trinity is one of those mysteries that is at the center of our faith and our understanding of it is minimal at best.

Part of one of the Prefaces to the Eucharistic prayer contains one of those statements. "Through your eternal Word you created all things and govern their course with infinite wisdom. In the Word made flesh, you have given us a mediator who has spoken your words to us and called us to follow him. He is the way that leads to you, the truth that sets us free, and the life that makes our joy complete. Through your Son you gather into one family men and women created for the glory of your name, redeemed by the blood of the cross, and sealed with the Holy Spirit."

To me that sounds like a perfectly crafted plan. We were created by God. We were lost on our own by the choices we made. The son was sent into the world to reconcile us with God and one another in God. He called us to follow him and learn from him as he would lead us to truth and our joy would be complete. This promise, given to us through the life, death and resurrection of his son, was sealed by the gift of the Spirit.

Now the Spirit, the Spirit of God, will lead us to the kingdom in the here and the now and in the hereafter. We may hear that and think that is a lot of meaningless words. Years ago I may have agreed. But as I was thinking about it I took the statement from the gospel in which Jesus says; "I have much more to tell you but you cannot hear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of Truth, he will guide you to all truth."

If someone were to have told me 39 years ago that I would have Masters Degree in Spirituality, and that I would be directing retreats and doing spiritual direction I would have said they were crazy. I had my life laid out for me and spirituality was certainly not in the cards. Remember the prayer of the seventh week of Easter: For God time is the unfolding of truth that already is and the unveiling of beauty that is yet to be. He knew where my truth lie and what would bring me joy, I thought I did as well. Yet I am very grateful that he won.

I would like to leave you with an image that is portrayed so beautifully before you. When we had the expert in stain glass window come to the church and give a presentation she showed a slide of a very ancient statue, the name of which I, unfortunately, do not remember. The statue is one of God the Father seated, resting on his knees is the cross beam of the crucifix with the bottom of the crucifix touching the floor and hovering over the Father and the Son is the Spirit. You may have to back up to see this but that is the image portray by the stain glass window, God the Father in the window, the cross beam of the crucifix on his knees and the dove below the crucifix or above Christ the High Priest; a beautiful image worthy of our reflection.

**Confirmation:** Celebrated annually for students in Youth Ministry. Contact Terry Witherell for more information.

**First Communion:** Celebrated annually for students in Grade 2. Contact Bill Dittrich for more information.

**Marriage:** Couples preparing to marry here should contact the Parish House at least one year in advance of the proposed wedding date. Parish marriage preparation programs are held in the spring and fall of each year and should be attended at least six months prior to the wedding.
