

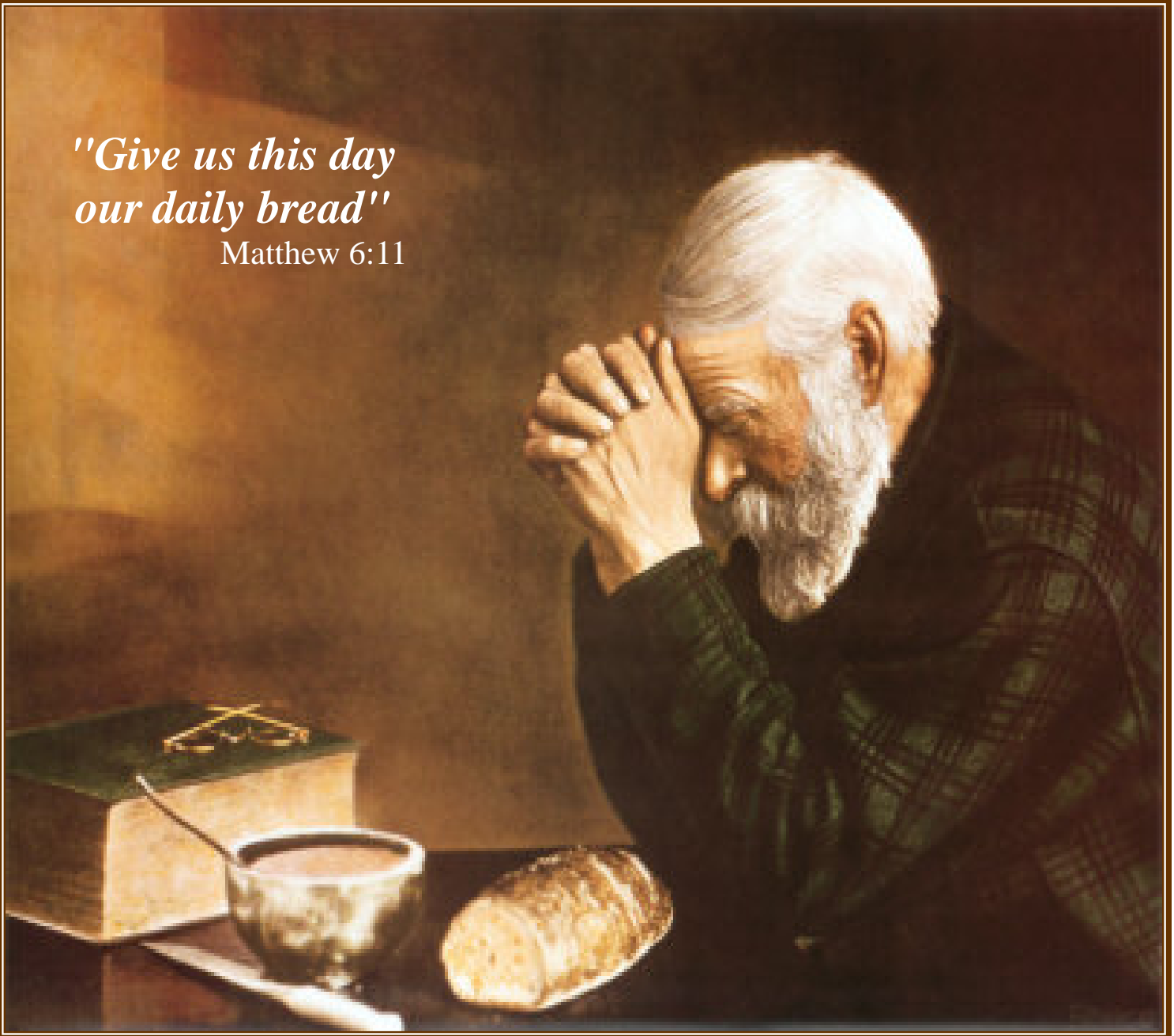

## A Message from the Co-Pastors

Once again we are faced with the story of Martha and Mary. Some of us who tend more toward Martha have a serious problem with Jesus' response to her: "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." The "Martha's" of the world all scream, "do you want to eat or not?" Those of you who tend more toward Mary probably see nothing wrong in what Jesus is saying.

What is Jesus really saying to us? Over the years I have come to believe that Jesus is calling us to a balance. In a gospel of the past week, Matthew 11:28-30, Jesus says, "Come to me, all of you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy and my burden light." There is a place and a need for the "Marthas" of the world and there is a place and a need for the "Marys" of the world. Each one of us is to discover the balance. Learn from me; Jesus says. How many times in the gospels do we hear about Jesus going off by himself or with friends to get away or to be with the Father?

Jesus used his time away to regroup, to collect himself, to renew himself in the Father, to rest in order to do what he felt called to do. For many of us, this is not part of our life. Life is too hectic, the pace too fast, and we sail through life doing our job, living our vocation and not enjoying the beauty of each day. Summer is traditionally a time when people slow down, rest, and relax and enjoy the gift it is.

I was rereading Shel Silverstein's "The Missing Piece" the other day. It is another fairytale for all ages. It is story about a circle with a missing piece and the circle is in search for the piece. As he searched he takes the time to notice what is around him. He takes the time to talk with those he meets; he enjoys the beauty of creation. After a period of time of trying on different pieces he finally comes across the one that fits. He is thrilled and off he goes. Now that he is a perfect circle his speed increases. He is no longer looking and consequently he no longer has time to notice, to meet, to chat; he rushes through life. One day it dawns on him that he is missing out and he takes the piece and throws it away, causing the circle to be less than perfect. It can no longer go with great speed. He again has the time to notice, meet and chat, and he is happy.

Are we the circle that sails through life, going from one thing to another and never really noticing what is all about us? Are we the ones who do not have time to notice, meet and chat? Is the Mary and the Martha in our life in balance? Maybe we look to Martha and Mary, to the circle and to ourselves? Are we missing out?
